Planning Board Minutes February 6, 2014

The Town of Cambridge Planning Board held its regular monthly meeting, Thursday, February 6, 2014, 7:30 PM, at the Town Hall.

Minutes

Communications

Secretary Sally Eddy stated she received updated information from the county on the procedure of how to file a subdivision map in Washington County. The Real Property Tax Office supplied the information.

Unfinished Business

Chairman Pearson commented he received several phone calls regarding the letter drafted by the planning board and sent to the county confirming the boundary line adjustment of the Dan Smith property. There seemed to be a lot of confusion about it. The county has since forwarded a copy to Mr. Smith's attorney and the matter appears to be settled. Secretary Eddy stated she also received calls, too. Chairman Pearson expressed his annoyance with the situation.

New Business

There were no subdivisions to address.

There was a brief discussion and exchange of comments regarding the recent meeting that took place in January at the American Legion on Route 22 with speakers from the NYS Department of State. John Pedersen acted as coordinator. Members agreed it was a good meeting, particularly in the aspect that all the surrounding towns were gathered in the same room discussing the same topic of growth and development. Hopefully, it sparked an interest in the future of developing a multi-town comprehensive plan since all the surrounding towns are similar and

those in attendance truly cared about preserving agriculture and the rural character of the area. However, getting all the towns to work together in agreement is another matter.

Members agreed that if Cambridge begins working on its own individual plan, educating the citizenry on what a comprehensive plan actually is and does is of the utmost importance. The public's involvement in all phases of developing a plan is crucial. It requires a fully committed Town Board with the voters pushing it.
